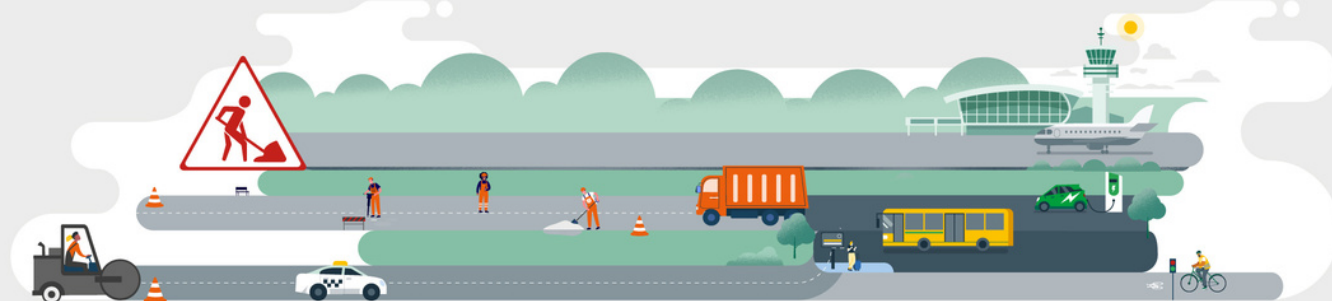




Mobility Flash Update - 10 September 2026

Dear colleague,

With this Mobility Flash Update, we would like to inform you about upcoming works on the access roads to and from Brussels Airport. Below please find an update of the major changes for **September-October***.

1. Works for the Airport Tram along Ringlaan

As part of the construction of the future airport tram line, utility networks will start on **14 September** on the Ringlaan, **between b.house and Building 8** (Bedrijvenzone Diegem Luchthaven, new: Kompaslaan). The works will continue until **mid-October** and will temporarily affect traffic flows.

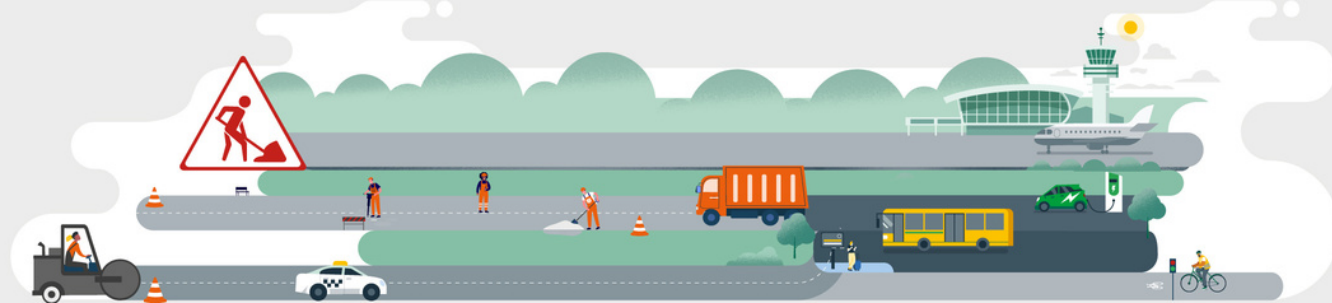
Below is an overview of the traffic measures that will apply during this period. For **cyclists and pedestrians**, access along the Ringlaan **will remain possible in both directions**. For **motorized vehicles**, **one-way traffic applies**.

From Cargo/P58 to the Terminal/A201

In this direction, traffic will remain largely unchanged. Motorised traffic (buses and cars) will operate as usual.

 The bus stop at **b.house** will remain at its **current location**.





From the Terminal/A201 to Cargo/P58

To ensure smooth traffic flow during the works, a **temporary diversion** will be in place in this direction. The diversion for motorised traffic (buses and cars) will follow:

- Da Vinci-tunnel
- Leonardo Da Vincilaan
- Olmenstraat
- Nieuwe Zaventemse Steenweg

before rejoining the Ringlaan. Please allow for a slightly longer travel time.

 In this direction, the **b.house** bus stop will be temporarily relocated to the area **close to Dela**.



2. Infrabel rail tunnel works: reduced train services

From 3 to 18 October included, Infrabel will carry out the final phase of works in the rail tunnel. The impact will be similar to that of the previous works.

Impact on train services:

- *Brussels Central*: 4 trains per hour instead of 6
- *Brussels European Quarter*: 1 train per hour instead of 2
- *Antwerp*: 1 train per hour instead of 2
- *Ghent*: 1 train per hour instead of 2 (longer travel time)

The greatest impact will be on connections towards Leuven/Hasselt and Leuven – Tienen – Landen – Liège. No direct trains will operate to or from Brussels Airport.

Alternatives:

- Take bus **R26** or **82** to **Zaventem station**. The **Knokke-Liège** IC train will exceptionally stop there during the works, providing **four train connections per hour to Leuven**. (Recommended option.)
- Travel via **Brussels-North** and transfer there.

Please plan your journey in advance and allow extra travel time where possible.
